Advanced Directives - Planning for the Future. Nov. 10, following the 9:30 Mass, St. Pius X Parish Center Presenter: Meg Ursick, Nurse Practitioner with the Palliative Medicine team at Nebraska Medicine Plan ahead and get the medical care you want at the end of life. Living wills and other advanced directives are written, legal instructions regarding your preferences for medical care if you are unable to make decisions for yourself. Advance directives guide choices for doctors and caregivers if you're terminally ill, seriously injured, in a coma, in the late stages of dementia or near the end of life. Advance directives aren't just for older adults. Unexpected end-of-life situations can happen at any age, so it's important for all adults to prepare these documents. By planning ahead, you can get the medical care you want, avoid unnecessary suffering and relieve caregivers of decision-making burdens during moments of crisis or grief. You also help reduce confusion or disagreement about the choices you would want people to make on your behalf. This is sponsored by St. Pius Health Ministry.

Hospitalization/Care Center Healthcare facilities do not notify us that you are in the hospital unless directly instructed to do so by you or your family. Yet we know how important it is for you to have spiritual and sacramental support while hospitalized. Here are some things you can do: Have someone, a family member or friend, to give us call beforehand, so we know when you will be in the hospital.

- During the admission process, be sure to provide both your religion and the name of your church. If the hospital fails to ask this question, inform your nurse of both your religion and your parish affiliation.
- If you are hospitalized, ask a member of your healthcare team to contact your clergy or ask to see the chaplain. The hospital spiritual care team will contact us.
- Let us know if there is a transfer to another care facility.

St. Pius X Finance Report

We continue to be extremely grateful for the financial support of our dedicated St. Pius X community. In the spirit of gratitude and with a commitment to being good stewards of the resources entrusted to us, we strive to maintain full transparency regarding our parish finances.

As we review the first quarter of this year (July 1 – September 30), we want to inform you that our parish had an operating loss of \$7,362. This shortfall presents challenges in fulfilling our mission and reaching our annual goals, which include renovating the Parish Center and establishing a Capital Improvements Reserve.

Fr. Mark has expressed a strong desire to fill the recently vacated Pastoral Associate position, a role crucial to our parish's continued growth and ministry. Unfortunately, due to current financial constraints, we have been unable to proceed with this hiring. Filling this key position is essential for our parish's long-term stability, but it will also introduce additional costs beyond our current shortfall.

We humbly ask for your continued support and prayerful consideration in increasing your contributions. Every gift, regardless of its size, will help us sustain our mission and strengthen our parish community.

We are grateful for your commitment and generosity. A detailed summary of our financial operations for the first quarter will be mailed out and made available to all parishioners in November.

Regarding Parish Center Renovations: We currently have \$31,000 in designated donations for this project which has an estimated initial phase cost of \$100,000. To move forward, we need an additional \$69,000 in pledges to reach this goal. We hope to begin renovations as soon as possible and appreciate any support you can offer at this time.
