FEBRUARY 2025 UPDATE

We are already planning the 2025 festival and we need your help! As many of you know, the festival is the top fund-raising activity for the parish. With these funds, we can update the parish center and contribute to the many ministries that St. Pius X supports. The success of the festival is dependent on the involvement of parishioners and SPSL families.

After Easter, you will see the festival donation sign-ups for food, books, time and talent. Right now, we **NEED**Captains for the following Festival areas:

CAKE WALK – The captain(s) is responsible for overseeing the setup of the Cake Walk booth in the parish center. Cake Walk Captain will be responsible for communicating with Festival Chairs to decide on the number of cakes needed and any signage or rules to be printed for volunteers. Cake Walk Captain will coordinate cake drop off on May 31st & June 1st prior to the festival starting. There is also the responsibility to oversee clean-up of the booth at the end of the festival or once all cakes are won.

GAMES – The captain(s) of the games will oversee the setup of the game booths in the parish center parking lot. The Men's club and the Knights of Columbus will do the heavy lifting and set-up each area. The Game Captain needs to ensure that all parts of each game are available and working. You will coordinate the volunteers who will man each of the games throughout the day. The Game Captain will be responsible for overseeing the take down and storage of the games at the end of the festival.

Craft Fair and Craft booth This year at the St Pius X Festival, we will be adding a Craft Fair. This will be in addition to our traditional craft booth. (more information on that down the road) Crafters may purchase a 6-foot table for \$60.00. The craft fair will be in the Gym with the hours of 11:00 to 4:00.
